







































































































FROM THE PUBLISHER'S DESK

third week of August, we

from creator **Max Milgate**. This one's a

series. The last week of the month, we have an adaptation of Jim Thompson's The Killer Inside Me by Devin Faraci and Vic Malhotra. Thompson's character, Lou Ford, is one of the scariest characters in all of crime fiction. Get ready for a deep dive into

the twisted mind of a serial killer who is also his town's deputy sheriff.

Teenage Mutant Nina Turtles Universe #1 is the start of an all-new series that will tie into our ongoing TMNT series. This issue has a main story

by Paul Allor, Tom Waltz, and Damian Couceiro with a back-up story by Kevin Eastman and Bill Sienkiewicz.

Everyone's favorite monster returns in *Godzilla*: *Rage Across Time*. Each issue will see Godzilla in a different time period and have a different creative team. Issue #1 finds Godzilla in feudal Japan and is by Jeremy Robinson and Matt Frank.

X-Files: Origins #1 explores the lives of Mulder and Scully before they were in the FBI. Matthew Dow Smith and Jody Houser share writing duties while Chris Fenoglio draws the story that follows a young Mulder as he investigates something strange happening on Martha's Vineyard. In a separate story, we find Dana Scully trying to find out who murdered her teacher in a tale illustrated by Corin Howell.

Jonathan Maberry edits our latest X-Files prose anthology, X-Files: Secret Agendas. The all-new stories are written by some of today's hottest mystery, thriller, science fiction and horror authors, including George Ivanoff, Joe Harris, Nancy Holder, Jeffrey Mariotte & Marsheila Rockwell, Lois Gresh, Lucy A.
